In Memoriam

- Former Baylor Basketball player **Michael Battle** passed away August 23, 2015, at the age of 56. Battle was a prolific dunker and a member of the Trinity Valley High School Hall of Fame in Athens, TX. He played for Baylor from 1979-81, and worked at the Dallas Bulk Mail Center for 30 years. BAA President Tom Nesbitt recalls that he went to the Baylor Basketball Camp one summer when Battle was a counselor. "He was a prince of a guy," Nesbitt recalls. "He would recognize us and talk to us during games after that

summer. Very sad to know that he is gone."

- **Nita Carol Kissel Fanning '76, JD '78**, passed away Aug. 21, 2015, at the age of 61. She practiced general and family law in Waco through her private practice and her work with Legal Aid. She is survived by her children, Aaron (and wife Nicole), Bret, and Arden Fanning; her brother, Andrew Kissel of Dallas and her sister and brother-in-law Connie Kissel Schroeder and Phil Schroeder of Garland; and two grandchildren.
- **Arthur William Bailey Jr. '51. JD '51**, passed away Aug. 19, 2015, at the age of 86. Bill, who was preceded in death by Roberta, his wife of 64 years, and his parents, was an outstanding tennis player at Waco High and also competed successfully throughout Texas in UIL Debate Tournaments. He served during the Korean Conflict in the U.S. Air Force in the Judge Advocates Division. Upon returning to Waco, he opted to go into the insurance business with his father, Arthur W. Bailey and become a noted state and national leader in the profession. Bill is served by three sons, Roy, Wesley, and Hatch and their families, which includes four granddaughters, six grandsons, and four great-grandchildren.
- **Wayne Cruseturner** passed away Aug. 15, 2014 in Los Angeles at the age of 77. Cruseturner majored in journalism at Baylor after serving with the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing at El Toro in the late 1950s. His writing career spanned four decades in the television and movie industry -- holding "cue cards," writing screenplays, creating the TV game show Gambit, and writing Farrah Fawcett's final episode of Charlie's Angels. Wayne is survived by Elisabeth, his wife of 22 years; his son Ashley and daughter-in-law Angela Russell Cruseturner of Waco, two grandsons, Caleb and Cade; four step-children and 10 step-grandchildren; and his sister and brother.
