University News

- **President Ken Starr** and associate Religion Professor **Dr. Christian van Gorder** represented Baylor at a three-day conference in Rome, Under Caesar's Sword, that addressed the question, When persecuted, how do Christian communities across the globe respond. Starr moderated a conference keynote panel on religious liberty in the Americas and Europe. Van Gorder shared findings on religious tolerance in Iran,

where about 10% of Christians have experienced persecutions such as imprisonment and lashings. Van Gorder is one of 14 scholars [who presented research regarding the responses of 100 Christian communities in 30 countries where Christians have been persecuted.](#)

- A team of Baylor engineering students will present a design in late January for the SpaceX Hyperloop Pod competition. Hyperloop pods use tubes stretched between major cities as above-ground, high-speed transportation, with people sitting in circular pods traveling through the tubes. The Baylor team will be presenting their design for a pod that would seat about 30 people. The presentation will take place at Design Weekend at Texas A&M Jan. 29-30.
- **Dino Babers**, who was a Baylor assistant football coach from 2008 to 2011 under Art Briles, has been named head football coach at Syracuse University. Babers, who is leaving the head coaching job at Bowling Green, uses Baylor's up-tempo spread with pro-style principles.

- **Michael Cuscurida** passed away Dec. 18, 2015, at the age of 89 in Waco. Michael, who earned his Master's and PhD in Organic Chemistry from Baylor, started working with Texaco Oil in Austin in 1974, where he spent most of his career at a research chemist and earned more than 100 patents. His obituary in the *Waco Trib* notes that he was invited to New York to have lunch with the corporate president after receiving his 100th patent and was told by his mother that it seemed like a long way to go for lunch. Mike was a member of the Boy Scouts of America and stayed best friends with many of his fellow Scouts over the years. He is survived by his sister, Sister Jo Ann Cuscurida, Daughter of Charity, in Evansville, IN, by his longtime friend, Madeline Kosler and more than 100 other family members.
- **Don Michael Hamm '61**, passed away on Dec. 14, 2015, in Houston at the age of 77. Mike was an attorney and CPA in private practice from 1974 until his retirement more than a decade ago, and was known for his ability to handicap horse races (including hitting "the big one" with the lone winning Pick Six ticket in 1992. Mike married Madeline McDermott on Feb. 29, 1972, with an anniversary every four years (his idea). In addition to Madeline, Mike is survived by niece Gabriela Hamm Jackson and a host of friends. - **Stuart Williamson '62** passed away Feb. 6, 2015, at the age of 74. Stuart, who received his degree in Religion, proudly served in the Peace Corps in the Philippines from 1962 to 1964 and as a chaplain's assistant in the U.S. Army in Vietnam 1967-68. He received a master's degree from the Episcopal Seminary of the Southwest in 1969. He worked as a corrections officer, grant writer, a purchaser for the Texas Department of Criminal Justice in Huntsville. He taught English as a second language to foreign students at Sam Houston State University, and was the founder of the Thoreau Woods Unitarian Universalist Church of Huntsville and started Habitat for Humanity in Walker County. He is survived by his devoted wife of 33 years, Beth (Drake) Williamson '62, his brother George Williamson, a sister-in-law: Lanelle Williamson, nieces and nephews, and great-nieces and great-nephews.
- **Billy Williams '63** passed away Dec. 14, 2015 at the age of 74. A great benefactor to Baylor, Williams lettered in football in 1962 and joined First National Bank of Fort

Worth's executive training program after graduation and went on to a 26-year career at Owens Corning, moving from field salesman to executive vice president for the building materials division. In 1991, Williams and two associates purchased Chicago-based Liquid Container LLP, where as president he oversaw its expansion from a regional manufacturer to a national presence in the plastics packaging industry before selling the company in 2011. Williams was named to the Baylor "B" Association's Wall of Honor in 2012. He and wife Elaine provided the lead gift for the Williams Family Soccer and Olympic Sports Center (which opened in October 2015) and committed in October 2015 to another multi-million-dollar gift for a golf practice facility near campus. Williams and his family also established two endowed scholarships at Baylor. Billy is survived by his wife Elaine; three children (Zach, Libby, and Andrew) and their families; and many other family members and friends.

- **Lari Stoermer Niles** of West passed away Dec. 19, 2015, at the age of 69. Lari, who earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees in education from Baylor, was a junior high school teacher in the West Independent School District, and also taught in Waco and Riesel. She loved race cars and held the title for the NCCC Drag Racing Record Holder. Lari is survived by her husband, Thomas Niles, two children, seven grandchildren, and her mother and two brothers.
- **Former State Senator Chris Harris** passed away Dec. 19, 2015, at the age of 67. A graduate of the Baylor Law School, Chris served portions of Tarrant, Denton, Johnson, Parker, and Dallas counties during a 28-year career as a state lawmaker that ended with his retirement in 2013 as the longest-serving Republican in the Texas Senate. He was chairman of the Senate Administration Committee for five terms, was the Senate President Pro Tem in 2001, and headed committees on jurisprudence and economic development. In obituaries about Harris, he was praised by University of Texas-Arlington President Vistasp Karbhari as "more than a friend of UTA...he was an integral part of the UTA vision and we will never forget his contributions to us. Harris is survived by his wife, Tammy, and five children.
- **Betty Jane "Janie" Gilliam** of Waco passed away Dec. 24, 2015, at the age of 88. She and her first husband, Culver "Pete" Gibson moved to Waco so Pete could complete his theology degree as a first step to attending seminary. At the time, she volunteered for the campaign to construct Baylor Stadium. After Pete's death, she spent 21 years as a records administrator in Baylor's Financial Aid Department. During her time at Baylor, she met and married Melvin Gilliam, a former member of the Waco City Council, longtime local grocer, and later a Baylor Bookstore employee. She is survived by her sons John and James Gibson and their families, which include two grandchildren.
