- **Clyde Mote**, who earned both his undergraduate and law degree in 1950, passed away Dec. 2, 2015 at the age of 89. A resident of Bullard, TX, Clyde was a World War II veteran and participated in the Battle of the Bulge. He was an assistant city attorney, private attorney, and corporate attorney before retiring in 1989. He retired to Emerald Bay on Lake Palestine near Tyler, TX. He is survived by his second wife, Roxann Mote; sons **Terron Mote Hayes '76**, Bruce and Douglas and their families.
- **Barbara Schultz Cunningham '54** passed away Jan. 15, 2016, at the age of 84 in Waco. Her life was a testimony to her faith. - **Gloria Gail Pelzel** of Lott passed away Jan. 22, 2016, at the age of 71. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from Baylor and her master's in education from Texas A&M. She worked in the Morgan, Bremond, Marlin, and Chilton school districts and retired as superintendent of the Westphalia ISD. University News

- Graduates in Baylor's education programs achieved a 100% pass rate on certification exams in the State of Texas for the second year in a row. The current rate reflects tests taken by Baylor students who graduated in the 2014-15 academic year. The overall state average for 2014-15 was 94%.
- Baylor has presented its Robert Foster Cherry Award for Great Teaching to Dr. Michelle Hebl, a Rice University psychology professor. Dr. Hebl will receive a \$250,000 grant and a semester-long teaching position. The Rice psychology

department will receive \$25,000. Hebl is expected to teach in residence during the Spring 2017 semester.

- [People Magazine has recognized Chemistry Professor Bryan Shaw](#) as part of its Heroes Among Us series of articles for his creation of an application that can detect eye cancer in children.
- Baylor is teaming up with Midland College to make the college-transfer process easier as part of its Baylor bound program. The agreement – the sixth that Baylor has signed with Texas schools -- gives Midland College students access to Baylor advisers, online degree requirement guides, special mailings, and the Baylor Library System interlibrary loan system.
- Baylor Athletics has installed a new Wi-Fi network in the Ferrell Center and is giving basketball fans more ways to engage with the game from their seats. [Here's a link to the article from BaylorProud.](#)
- Baylor and University of Mississippi officials are in discussions to play a 2020 football game at NRG Stadium in Houston as part of efforts to get Big 12 schools to play at least one Power 5 school each year in non-conference. Baylor faces Duke from the ACC in 2017-18, but doesn't have another Power 5 team scheduled until Utah from the Pac-12 in 2023-24.
- Baylor's new President's Advisory Council on Diversity is moving forward with plans to create a Chief Diversity Officer position, despite concerns from some faculty members. - Two new exhibits at the Mayborn Museum are celebrating Tinkertoys and Mr. Potato Head as a salute to young imaginations and creativity. The exhibits, which were created by the Betty Brinn Children's Museum in Milwaukee, [will be at the Mayborn through May 1.](#)
